We have already begun to work on details of next year's reunion in Detroit area, and your feedback is important to the planning of an even better reunion.


Our Officers continue to meet on a regular monthly basis, and are focused on ensuring our member experience is the best it can be, especially for carrying on the legacy of our Veterans!

Thanks again to everyone who made the 2018 Washington DC reunion very special and so successful!



93rd Bombardment Group Annual Meeting October 20, 2018 National Capitol Area DRAFT

President Jim Root called the meeting to order at 9:43 a.m.

The Minutes of the 2017 Reunion in San Antonio were presented and approved.

Jim reviewed communications from within and outside the 93rd. We maintain contact with other WWII organizations and he called attention to officers' meetings which are held monthly, our website, and our "Ball of Fire" newsletter.

Membership Report Jim Root

Jim gave the membership report in the absence of Jean Koznarek. We have a total of 228 members which includes 36 veterans and 25 new members. Jean has also eliminated Donor Perfect software and moved to the less expensive Excel spreadsheet.

Financial Report Wally Brown

Treasurer Wally Brown presented the 2017-2018 financial report. He reported a fund starting balance as of October, 2017 of \$20,593. We had income over the past year of \$69,777 which includes \$24,372 for the film fundraiser. With expenses of \$14,536 (including deposits and advances for the WDC 2018 reunion) we have an ending, current balance of \$75,834. Projected total expenses for the WDC 2018 reunion are \$32,001, leaving a reunion balance of \$3,358.

Wally reported that he has merged the reunion fund with the general fund.

The financial report was moved and approved.

The books were audited by Becky Burch, Wayne Baker and Steve Senatore.

"Ball of Fire" Report Don Morrison and George Jung

Don emphasized the need to keep sending articles and George noted that we are about 50/50 on email copies versus mailed copies of our newsletter.

Historian's Report Don Morrison

Don continues to get requests from families looking for information on their veterans. He monitors social media, especially Facebook, for information. He searches for 93rd stuff on the internet and auction sites, etc., and has his own collection, but also supports the museum at Hardwick with artifacts. He continues to research the men and aircraft of our Bomb Group and has spent time this year supporting Michael Sellers with his work on the film.

Website Michael Sellers

Michael shared some of his thoughts on updating the website. He is considering making it more interactive, updating films and photos, enhancing search and research tools, and creating a searchable "Ted's Travelling Circus." He would also like to have an option to pay for reunions on line through the site, as well as monthly updates through a newsletter.

Hardwick 104 Film Michael Sellers

All is ready for showing the "rough cut" of the film after tonight's banquet. In the post production phase, Michael would like to add more graphics and more archival films along with final color and audio mix. Other tasks include photo rights and clearances. Distribution options include Netflix, Amazon, and PBS. There could also be road shows which would include military bases.

"Hot Stuff" Update Jim Root

In the absence of Jim Lux, Jim reviewed the monument dedication in Iceland. He thanked the 93rd donors, and both Jim Lux and Nancy Stranger for their efforts in making this incredible project happen.

Report on the 2018 Reunion John Marx

Our Reunion Coordinator presented the numbers from our current Reunion. Pending final accounting, we had 78 attendees, including three veterans. The receipts totaled \$31,800 and expenses were \$29,895 leaving a balance of \$5,605.

2019 Reunion Update John Marx

The dates will be October 10-14, 2019 in the Detroit, Michigan area. We will be staying at the Sheraton with a shuttle to the airport. Cost, including breakfast, is \$118.56 and it has on-site dining. It will include visits to the Yankee Air Museum and the Henry Ford Museum. John stated that it will be our 19th reunion. In addition, during those years, there were four trips to Hardwick and also a trip to Iceland.

Selection of the 2020 Reunion Site John Marx

John reviewed some of the criteria used in site selection which includes: an association with the 93rd, an aviation focus, easy access by air, meeting accommodations at reasonable rates, and rotation through different regions of the country. The cities under consideration were, Seattle, Salt Lake City, Savannah, Pensacola, Tucson, and San Diego. After the voting process, <u>Salt Lake City was chosen as our 2020 site.</u>

Election of Officers Jim Root

The current slate of officers was recommended for reelection with the exception of Secretary Nick Timmer, who is retiring after six years. Pam Kawashima was nominated to take his place. It was moved to reelect the slate of candidates as presented. The motion passed. Jim noted that JoAnne Sargent will be the Assistant Reunion Coordinator.

Member Input Jim Root

Jim asked for comments and there was a short discussion about strategies for recruiting new members and keeping them once they join. Perhaps the movie could have a tag line for membership. Jim thanked the veterans for their attendance and mentioned the incredible experience of watching them lay a wreath at the "Tomb of the Unknown Soldier."

Jim announced that the Timberlake Award would be presented at the memorial dinner this evening.

The meeting was adjourned at 11:29

2018 Reunion Financial Results

The 2018 Reunion concluded with a balance of \$3,358 in the reunion fund. This is a reduction of \$340 from the beginning balance. This minor shortfall was largely due to unanticipated transportation costs. Our goal is to generate receipts adequate to cover all reunion expenses. The total expenses were \$32,001 slightly more than our receipts of \$31,661. The difference was about 1%. We had 82 attendees including three 93rd Bomb Group veterans. The results follow:

Army Air Corps or Army Air Forces? Which is correct?

Recently a reader of the *Military Officer*, the quarterly news magazine of the Military Officer's Association of America, pointed out my incorrect use of "Army Air Corps" when announcing our 2018 reunion. I have always used "Army Air Corps" and "Army Air Forces" interchangeably and have probably offended our veterans inadvertently. To any who noted my mistake please accept my sincere apology. As I thought about this topic, I realized that I might not be alone and an explanation would be in order. So here goes.

The United States Army Air Corps (USAAC) was created from the Air Service on 2 July 1926 as a part of the United States Army. The USAAC was the forerunner of the United States Air Force and the immediate predecessor of the United States Army Air Forces (USAAF) established in 1941. The USAAC ended on 9 March 1942.

The USAAC became the United States Army Air Forces (USAAF) on June 20, 1941 to signify greater autonomy from the Army's command structure. It remained as a combat arm of the Army until 1947, when the Department of the Air Force was established by the National Defense Act of 1947. The USAAF, like the other combat arms was empowered to create large force units that could be assigned to either independent missions or to the theaters of war under unified command. Thus, the AAF created its numbered air forces, equivalent to infantry or armored armies and naval fleets.



The 93rd Bombardment Group was a part of the United States Army Air Forces from its inception. Although some use of the term "Army Air Corps" continued after 1942 the correct term was always the **Army Air Forces**. Now you know!




GREETINGS FROM THE 93RD BG HISTORIAN!

Notice of C. G. Sorrell (Gordon) being killed on October 29, 1942 in an aircraft accident.



I'd like to personally thank everyone who attended the "Sneak Preview" of the 93rd's documentary currently in production. We had about 100 people in attendance and most were donors of the film. I was very happy to be able to show a complete rough cut of the project. It has been a very long road to get to this stage and I was happy to be able to share it with everyone.


Currently the film is going through its final paces to reach a "Locked Cut". This process started right after the reunion and is still currently underway. The preview screening at the reunion was about 84 minutes long (without credits at the end). I would like to cut 10 minutes from the film and make it more attractive to an average viewer who may not be connected to our group but might be interested in the stories and the history. Pockets of information in the film might be so specific that we (93rd members) would get certain references of the groups history but an average audience member might not. It will also make the film more attractive to a PBS screening or on popular streaming services like Netfilx. A final stage will be getting all rights and clearances for photos and films. We have started that process with a few pieces of media but a full indexing of the film needs to occur.
